The Centre operates under the framework of two international treaties: the Barcelona Convention, which brings together the 21 Mediterranean neighbouring and the European Union countries to work together for sustainable development; and the Stockholm Convention, an international agreement involving around 180 countries to fight against persistent organic pollutants, highly polluting and toxic substances.

The Centre belongs to the Mediterranean Action Plan, an organization under the umbrella of the United Nations Environment Programme. Under that institutional framework, SCP/RAC has an official mandate as an organization that engages in international cooperation with Mediterranean countries on development and innovation in the production sector and civil society, based on Sustainable Consumption and Production (SCP) patterns.

The SCP approach is about the combined implementation of tools and measures geared towards redesigning how goods and services are consumed and produced to drive the revitalization of industrial and socioeconomic development towards nonpolluting, no-waste, low-carbon, resource-efficient, socially inclusive and circular economies.
